7:35-8:00- Snowflake Program

Now each person is going to get a piece of paper to make paper snowflakes. Snowflakes represent YOUR individuality as a person and as a BBG.

Now look at your snowflakes. Notice how each and every single one of yours is different. None of these are alike. Just like how none of you are like and each of you are unique and special in your own way.

8:05-8:30-Compliment Program

Each girl is going to get a piece of paper taped to their back. I'm going to play some relaxing music. You are going to write absolutely anything that would would like, but make sure it is a compliment and positive. Make sure that the girl you are writing on, doesn't know who you are.

8:35-9:35 Sisterhood Program:

Simone: I would like each of you to take a moment and think about what sisterhood means to you. What is good sisterhood? What is bad sisterhood? What are some memories you have of sisterhood?

Maya: Please take a few minutes and think of your personal definition of sisterhood and an example of good and bad sisterhood. What does sisterhood mean to you?

Simone: Sisterhood is the driving force of BBG. It is what makes BBYO a safe place, a haven where no one else can invade or break in. Sisterhood is each and every single one of you.

We would like each of you to take a few minutes and think about what you love about BBG. For us, we know it comes down to sisterhood. The connections we make with the amazing people.

Maya: On one column, we will write down what we love about BBG. On the other column, we will write things that you personally would like to see improved.

Please take hands with the girl next to you. We will now pass a pulse around. This pulse is your connection to BBG and your personal commitment to sisterhood. This is all of our love combined. Together, we are unstoppable, an unbreakable force of love. We are sisterhood. As you receive the pulse, please join us in saying: "We are sisterhood."

Simone/Maya:Girls, we are sisterhood. We are BBG's and we are unbreakable and we are united.

9:35-9:50- BBYO Jello

We will now be playing Jello. Please get into a circle. The way that Jello works is that there is one person in the middle. That person points at a person and that person and the two people on either side of them do a certain action. To make this more relevant to BBYO, we will doing Jello BBYO style.

Things we will be doing will be:

BBG's: Girl in the middle sings a BBG cheer, and two girls on other side are AZA's fawning on her.

Cows: All three girls are cows, and moo.

Bears: All three girls are bears, and growl.

B'nai Brith Girl: You have to say Girl before I get to the end of the sentence, otherwise you are out.

Draw a orange triangle if you feel that this time of year is a time of universal love and acceptance no matter what holiday you celebrate.

Draw a red triangle if you really do like all the holiday songs and the spirit of December.

Draw a green pentagon if you enjoy giving gifts.

Draw a blue square if you have ever been curious about other religions.

Draw a red rectangle if you have ever been intolerant of other religions when you were younger.

Draw a yellow square if you now are way more tolerant of other religions and the holidays in general.
